

Japan-United States Joint Communique

June 22, 1961

(Clause on CULCON)

President Kennedy and Prime Minister Ikeda concluded today a constructive and friendly exchange of views on the present international situation and on relations between the United States and Japan. Secretary Rusk, Foreign Minister Kosaka, and other United States and Japanese officials participated in the conversations.

(Cultural and Educational Cooperation)

The President and the Prime Minister also recognized the importance of broadening educational, cultural and scientific cooperation between the two countries. They therefore agreed to form two United States-Japan committees, one to study expanded cultural and educational cooperation between the two countries and the other to seek ways to strengthen scientific cooperation.
